

The project « Enjoy your Future » was funded with the support of the European Union under the Programme "Europe for Citizens"

4 events with 38 sub-events have been carried out within this project:

EVENT 1 – Collection of opinion through the online game

Participation: 444 people, including 181 participants from Italy, 42 participants from France, 129 participants from Belgium, 22 participants from Hungary, 70 participants from other European countries.

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Italy, France, Belgium and Hungary** from 1/12/2017 to 31/01/2018

Short description: The event was the collection of opinions of young people about the future of Europe through the multilingual online game prepared by partners. The promotion of the game has been done through social networks, on line articles and public events. We have collected the opinions of 444 people. In the public sub-events we involved **314** participants, including 106 participants from Italy, 57 participants from France, 116 participants from Belgium, 35 participants from Hungary.

Sub-EVENT 1.1

Participation: The event involved 23 young citizens, including 17 participants from the city of Brussels (Belgium), 2 participants from Ghent (Belgium), 1 participant from Leuven (Belgium), 2 participants from Liège (Belgium), and 1 participant from Maastricht (The Netherlands).

Location / Dates: The event took place in **De Blauwput (Leuven, Belgium)**, from 01/12/2017 to 03/12/2017.

Short description: The aim of the event was to train our most active volunteers and give them the right skills to speak in public, to make effective advocacy strategies and to inform them about JEF Belgium's biggest project in the coming year: Enjoy Your Future. We explained the aim of the game in the first stage of the project, and suggested some best practices in order to promote the game. Additionally, we had a policy workshop where the five main topics of the game were discussed among our participants. The main aim was to empower our local sections to carry out projects within the Enjoy Your Future project, to spread the online game, and to give them the right tools and campaigning material for this.

Sub-EVENT 1.2

Participation: The event involved 7 volunteers of the national team, including 1 participant from Paris, 2 from Strasbourg, 2 from Brussels and 1 from Toulouse (France).

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Nancy (France)**, on 8/12-9/12/2017

Short description: The aim of this event was to prepare the national team to handle Enjoy Your Future project. After explanations on the organisational framework, it has been decided that the international officer would be in charge of project coordination with partners, while local development officers would help in the organization of events in relation with local branches of the association. The treasurer would take care of the financial aspects and the reporting of the project.

Then the national team had a brainstorm to define the strategy of communication of JEF France within the project, in order to mobilize a maximum of participants.

They designed several events to run under Enjoy Your Future, in different cities of France so that to include a broader range of people: Paris, but also Bordeaux, Strasbourg, Clermont-Ferrand, as well as Montpellier, Rennes, Nancy, Le Havre for the dissemination phase. A time was also dedicated to the preparation of the opening event, that was planned a 10 days after. They designed the workshops' form and content, and planned to hold other workshops in universities following this day so that to give a start in Paris but also in other cities.

Sub-EVENT 1.3

Participation: The event involved 35 citizens, all from the city of Budapest (Hungary).

Location / Dates: The event took place at Corvinus University of Budapest (**Budapest, Hungary**), on 12/12/2017

Short description: The aim of the event was to organize a roundtable discussion with 3 invited speakers. The speakers delivered a preliminary lecture highlighting the major aspects of the topic and afterwards facilitated a high-quality round table discussion. Discussions rolled around the societal and sociological aspects of the independence of Catalonia. They touched upon all underlying subtopics, of the origins, and background information of the aims and potential culmination of the independence movement of Catalonia. Discussing the dilemma of the extent of integration and borders were especially dominating the event.

The topic was relevant according to the project because it was connected with the topic of borders. One of the core topics of the speakers was what will be the future if Catalonia, a now country or a part of Spain. This question concerns a lot the European Parliament and the institutions. A possible decision can be the basic for several other countries too.

The event has been an important occasion to promote the game and the relevance of the project, according to what was happening in Europe in those days.

Sub-EVENT 1.4

Participation: The workshops gathered about 50 young participants, including 47 participants from the city of Paris (France), 1 participant from the city of Dijon (France), 1 participant from the city of Strasbourg (France), and 1 participant from the city of Brest (France).

Location/Dates: The event took place in **Paris (France)** on 18/12/2017

Short description: The aim of the event was to kick-off Enjoy Your Future project with a number of workshops debating of issues of EU-wide higher education and the Bologna Process. The workshops were organized and run by Young Europeans - France volunteers, together with key academic players. The following topics were discussed, in the framework of EYF focus on Youth, Integration and Work:

- Working in Europe today and in the future
- A Higher Education Europe in globalisation
- European Universities

This built a basis for further thinking at the local scale, once the participants were back in their universities. The aim was to disseminate this reflection everywhere in France, mostly among students and university employees to gather even more propositions from our members on the above mentioned topics. This work was a basis for the draft of a position paper, that was then sent to the Minister of Higher Education in order to broaden the impact of students' reflections. The event has also been a chance to promote the online game.

Sub-EVENT 1.5

Participation: The event involved 25 citizens, including 7 participants from the city of Turin (Italy), 3 participants from the city of Florence (Italy), 5 participants from the city of Bologna (Italy), 2 participants from the city of Novara (Italy), 3 participants from the city of Trieste (Italy), 2 participants from the city of Verbania (Italy), 1 participant from Paris (France), 2 participants from Foligno (Italy).

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Turin (Italy)** on 05/01/2018

Short description: Presentation of the project and of the game to representatives of different Italian associations. Meeting with journalist Christian Costamagna on European borders, in particular on the integration process of Serbia.

Sub-EVENT 1.6

Participation: The event involved 30 citizens from the city of Brussels (Belgium).

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Brussels (Belgium)** on 11/01/2018.

Short description: The aim of the event was to have an informal discussion about the future of Europe and let attendants play the online game. It was framed as an informal New Year's gathering with the purpose to attract a different public to engage them in discussions about the future of Europe.

Sub-EVENT 1.7

Participation: The event involved 20 citizens, including 3 participants from the city of Turin (Italy), 17 participants from the city of Cuneo (Italy)

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Cuneo (Italy)** on 25/01/2018

Short description: Presentation of the project and of the game to representatives of different Italian association those work in Piemonte region. The event RisorsEuropa has been organized by the CRC.

Sub-EVENT 1.8

Participation: The event involved 30 citizens, including approximately 30 participants from the city of Rome (Italy).

Location / Dates: The event took place in University Roma Tre (**Rome, Italy**), on 26/01/2018 morning.

Short description: Involving young university students to collect their opinions on the five topics through the online game: this was the aim of this event. In order to accomplish that, some members of our organization have placed a stand in front of the university, distributing material linked to the project and collecting responses to the online questionnaire submitted through tablets.

Sub-EVENT 1.9

Participation: The event involved 31 citizens, including 17 participants from the city of Rome (Italy), 2 participants from the city of Milan (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Vibo Valentia (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Frosinone (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Bologna (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Avellino (Italy), 2 participants from the city of Verona (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Florence (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Pistoia (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Amsterdam (Netherlands), 1 participant from the city of Viterbo (Italy), 1 participant from the city of London (England), 1 participant from France.

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Rome (Italy)** on 26/01/2018 afternoon.

Short description: The main goal of this event was to make the young participants reflect on the 5 topics tackled in the online game: borders, integration, organized crime, youth, work. 5 working groups were arranged and each group was led by one expert, who kept the discussion focused. The resulting reflections and main conclusions of each group were later presented to all the participants during a plenary session. Final remarks were given by Marco Piantini, European affairs Advisor of the *Italian President of the Council*. During the event, all the participants were also able to give their responses to the online game.

Sub-EVENT 1.10

Participation: The event involved 63 citizens, including 3 participants from the city of Brussels (Belgium), 60 participants from Germany.

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Brussels (Belgium)** on 31/01/2018.

Short description: The aim of the event was to inspire a group of 60 Germans who visited Brussels to transform their ideas for the future of Europe into concrete recommendations. We promoted the online game as a basis for discussions on topics, because it is a useful tool for this. We mainly discussed the themes youth and employment, because the German participants were finishing their year of voluntary civil service and it fitted well with their background. We also organised a little quiz on these topics to kick off the event with a playful tone to encourage active participation of the citizens.

EVENT 2 – Meetings on five topics and elaboration of programmatic documents of proposals

Participation: 470 people, including 271 participants from Italy, 48 participants from France, participants 61 from Belgium, 76 participants from Hungary and 14 participants from other European countries.

Location / Dates: The events took place in **Italy, France, Belgium and Hungary** from **1/02/2018 to 28/07/2018**

Short description: We have analyzed the results of the online game and deepened the five topics of the project. To do so, we organized meetings in each country with young representatives from every partner in order to elaborate a document about the future of Europe focusing on the topics of: borders, integration, criminal organizations, youth and work.

Sub EVENT 2.1

Participation: The event involved 24 citizens, including 1 trainer from the city of Skopje (Macedonia), 1 trainer from the city of Bratislava (Slovakia), 1 trainer from A Coruna (Spain), 1 trainer from Aachen (Germany), 1 trainer from Ljubljana (Slovenia) and 20 young citizens from Budapest (Hungary).

Location / Dates: The event took place at Corvinus University of **Budapest (Hungary)**, from 02/02/2018 to 03/02/2018

Short description: It gathered foreign and Hungarian youngsters to discuss on the most pressing hot topics affecting the oftentimes gruesome outlook they have on their immediate future, the challenges next generations will be facing. These topics were strongly related to the project Enjoy Your Future. Among many things, the wild competition and scarce employment prospects, the urgency of effectively tackling global climate change, the need to fully eliminate unpaid/underpaid youth employment in internships/entry level job positions, the segregation of vulnerable rural youth, EU-wide and globally spreading political propaganda. Political activism is key, they concluded, as one can only start effectively changing the system from within.

Sub EVENT 2.2.

Participation: The event involved 27 citizens, including 25 participants from the city of Brussels (Belgium), and 2 participants from the city of Cardiff (United Kingdom).

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Brussels (Belgium)** on 07/02/2018.

Short description: The aim of the event was to discuss one of the topics within the framework of the Enjoy Your Future project: European integration. We invited two speakers to make a comparison between the architecture of the EU and the federal structure of Belgium in order to give participants the right tools to think about whether a federal structure could be a solution to the problems the EU is facing or not. There was a lively discussion about whether the EU should integrate further or not, which policy areas should get priority and whether the EU should expand to other European countries.

Sub EVENT 2.3

Participation: The event involved 20 citizens, including 20 participants from the city of Brussels (Belgium).

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Brussels (Belgium)** on 14/02/2018.

Short description: The aim of the event was to discuss how the EU should brand itself when tackling the topics that are a part of the Enjoy Your Future project (youth, employment, integration, borders and criminal organizations). We used the topic “branding on social media” as a hook to involve a different set of participants in this event, to make the event more accessible for participants with less technical knowledge about the European Union, which worked well.

Sub EVENT 2.4

Participation: The event involved 22 citizens, including 3 participants from the region of Lorraine (France), 1 participant from the city of Rennes, 10 participants from the city of Paris, 2 participants from the city of Bordeaux, 2 participants from the city of Toulouse, 1 participant from the city of Lyon and 3 participants from the city of Strasbourg.

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Bordeaux (France)**, on the 17/02/2018 and 18/02/2018.

Short description: Following a training about civic participation and political activism, the Young Europeans France organized a session of policy thinking aiming to make local French volunteers meet and share their thoughts about the future of Europe. Those who took part in the debate were mostly in charge in their local associations, and thus able to further organize debate and policy events at the local scale. They adopted a resolution about Posted Workers, and discussed one about the refugee crisis in the EU, in line with EYF topics on Work and Borders.

Sub- EVENT 2.5

Participation: The event involved 41 citizens, including 34 participants from the city of Turin (Italy), 3 participants from the city of Ivrea (Italy), 4 participants from the city of Verbania (Italy) etc.

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Turin (Italy)** on 14/03/2018

Short description: The aim of the event was to involve participants in a reflection on European citizenship and integration. The reflection was on the European citizenship as an instrument of the integration process and the creation of a European Union based on shared values and rights. The event was also an occasion to compare different models of Citizenship there are in different European countries with the Professor Francesco Costamagna.

Sub- EVENT 2.6

Participation: The event involved 18 citizens, including 18 participants from the city of Budapest (Hungary).

Location / Dates: The event took place in Corvinus University of **Budapest (Hungary)**, on 06/04/2018

Short description: The aim of the first part of the event was to work through what participants think about the issues of organized crime, challenges and aspirations of European and global as well as the unemployment situation and generational differences among generations commonly labeled as X, Y, Z as so on - and also how the digitalization of the past years is going to continue affect how society will and should re-think its future as such. The second part was the topic of Youth. We collected ideas from the participants how to create a better Europe and how they would like to live in Europe.

Sub- EVENT 2.7

Participation: The event involved 29 citizens, including 24 participants from the city of Turin (Italy), 5 participants from the city of Chivasso (Italy) etc.

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Turin (Italy)** on 09/04/2018

Short description: The aim of the event was to reflect on organized crime in European Union. Especially, on how organized crime spread in Europe and on which political instruments there are to fight against organized crime in a common way. The activity has been realized in a place confiscated to the 'Ndrangheta, one of the strongest Italian criminal organization, with the contribution of the ex-member of the Italian Parliament Davide Mattiello

Sub- EVENT 2.8

Participation: The event involved 17 citizens, including 1 participants from the city of Rome (Italy), 16 participants from the city of Turin (Italy) etc.

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Turin (Italy)** on 18/04/2018

Short description: The aim of the event was to reflect on the role of young people for the future of Europe. During the event there was the intervention of the journalist Luca Mariani, that shared with participant the story of Utoya massacre happened in 22/07/2011. Starting from the killing of those young people who believed in a Europe based on multiculturalism and peace, the reflection turned on the role of youth in the promotion of European values and in the contrasting to nationalistic feelings and movements among Europe.

Sub- EVENT 2.9

Participation: The event involved 10 citizens, including 2 participants from the city of Brussels (Belgium), 5 participants from the city of Paris, 2 participants from the city of Strasbourg (France) and 1 participant from the city of Toulouse (France).

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Lyon (France)** from 21/04/2018 to 22/04/2018.

Short description: The aim of the event was to discuss the management of Enjoy Your Future project in France. The national team set the framework for the organization of labelled local events, together with Arda Suzer from Lyon, the volunteer in charge of the local coordination of the project. The outline of the second policy seminar has also been determined.

Sub- EVENT 2.10

Participation: The event involved 15 citizens, including 15 participants from the city of Budapest (Hungary) .

Location / Dates: The event took place in Corvinus University of **Budapest (Hungary)**, on 04/05/2018

Short description: The aim of the event was about integration and the European borders. The main topics of this moderated discussion/debate event were borders, integration and multiculturalism - with a special and deep focus and interest in migration and global challenges.

Sub- EVENT 2.11

Participation: The event involved 21 citizens, including 21 participants from the city of Budapest (Hungary)

Location / Dates: The event took place at Liberty Square (**Budapest, Hungary**), on 13/05/2018

Short description: The aim of the event was to find presenters for the final conference originally planned to June. 3 of our members (Bálint Caesar, president of AEGEE-Budapest, Réka Salamon, appointed Project Officer of "Enjoy Your Future" from our organization's side as well as Tekla Hajdu, another local organizer) were actively participating on the annual, one-day-long high-profile "Europe Day" Youth Festival in the heart of Budapest, where European-minded civil society organizations and relevant stakeholders gathered together to collectively spread the word about virtually any EU-related topics via creative programmes and information stands.

From our side, the mainstreaming of our trademark activities as AEGEE-Budapest, as well as the promotion of the project itself was carried out among participants and visitors of the festival.

The planned closing conference "Quo vadis Europe?" was also promoted and highlighted.

Sub-EVENT 2.12

Participation: The event involved 16 citizens, including 2 participants from the city of Lyon (France), 7 participants from the city of Paris, 5 participants from the city of Strasbourg, 1 participant from the city of Rennes, and 1 participant from the city of Toulouse.

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Strasbourg (France)**, on 03/06/2018.

Short description: Following the European Youth Event organized by the European Parliament in Strasbourg, the Young Europeans France organized on Sunday a policy seminar aiming to make local French volunteers meet and share their thinking about the future of Europe, thanks to group discussions with participants from different backgrounds on a number of current European challenges in the perspective of the 2019 European elections, using non-formal and innovative discussion formats. The main objective was to write political proposals addressed to public decision makers, which will be used within the framework of the Enjoy Your Future project, as well as maybe for the sake of the European elections campaign in 2019.

The event was organized in the form of a World Café, divided in sessions of 50 minutes on each topic: Frontiers, Organized Crime, Working in Europe, Integration, Youth. The first session aimed at contextualizing the topic, assessing the current situation and analyzing it using documentation provided by the organizers, as well as the results of the first step of the Enjoy Your Future project (which was a questionnaire). These resources could be used by participants to illustrate their proposals with concrete examples, if needed.

The second session was dedicated to writing proposals and concrete solutions to the problems or issues identified by participants earlier in the day.

A plenary session in the afternoon enabled them to discuss the different topics and contribute to almost all of them by commenting and amending the other groups' proposals, which were voted at the end. These ideas will then be presented to European decision makers.

Sub-EVENT 2.13

Participation: The event involved 12 citizens, including 12 participants from the city of Turin (Italy) etc.

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Turin (Italy)** on 14/06/2018

Short description: Work is the instrument that allows each citizen to contribute to the society and to reach full dignity, as well as a fundamental way to achieve self-fulfillment. Data on youth unemployment in Europe are alarming and this led us to investigate the problems and strategies of the various European countries based on the data collected with the EXCEPT research (<http://www.except-project.eu/home/>)

With the contribution of Professor Sonia Bertolini and the researcher Magda Bolzoni of the University of Turin, we reflected starting from the results of this comparative research and the different welfare policies in EU countries, in particular for what concerns support the living and economic independence of young people.

Sub- EVENT 2.14

Participation: The event involved 20 citizens, including 15 participants from Turin (Italy), 2 participants from the city of Sicily (Italy), 1 participant from Paris (France), 1 participant from Madalin (Colombia), 1 participant from Liguria (Italy).

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Turin (Italy)** on 19/06/2018

Short description: Dialogue and debate on Serbia and Ukraine and their relationship with the European Union and other global powers, starting from the experience of two projects promoted by Italian associations:

- the Meridiano d'Europa 2018 "Inside Out" which brought 300 young people to Belgrade to talk about European citizenship and the future of Serbia

- "Sul Confine", an experience born of the RetròScena association that organizes experiences of meeting and volunteering with some Ukrainian associations for European citizens.

Sub-EVENT 2.15

Participation: The event involved 14 participants from the city of Brussels (Belgium).

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Brussels (Belgium)** on 20/06/2018.

Short description: The aim of the event was to discuss the five topics of the Enjoy Your Future project (youth, employment, integration, borders and criminal organizations) in a smaller group in the format of a book club, with one person taking the lead and setting the background of each topic and the participants then pitched in with their own ideas about the five topics, discussing also ways forward for the EU. It was a way to both enhance their public speaking skills and put forward recommendations for the future of the European Union on the five Enjoy Your Future topics. We gave a little prize to encourage the best public speaker on each topic to continue speaking up about the issues and the future of Europe.

Sub-EVENT 2.16

Participation: The event involved 20 citizens, including 15 participants from Turin (Italy), 2 participants from the city of Sicily (Italy), 1 participant from Paris (France), 1 participant from Madalin (Colombia), 1 participant from Liguria (Italy).

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Turin (Italy)** on 06/07/2018

Short description: Thematic world-café to collect opinions and proposals for the future of Europe, starting from the five main topics of the project: organised crime, borders, integration, work and youth.

After the world-café we started the writing of our document of proposals.

Sub- EVENT 2.17

Participation: The event involved 54 citizens, including 3 participants from the city of Florence (Italy), 3 participants from the city of Turin (Italy), 2 participants from the city of Vibo Valentia (Italy), 2 participants from the city of Milan, 1 participant from the city of Pavia (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Sondrio (Italy), 3 participants from the city of Trento, 4 participants from the city of Viterbo (Italy), 3 participants from the city of Verona (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Avellino (Italy), 2 participants from the city of Pisa (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Aosta (Italy), 2 participants from the city of Frosinone (Italy), 5 participants from the city of Naples, 1 participant from the city of Castelfranco Veneto (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Prato (Italy), 8 participants from the city of Rome (Italy), 2 participants from the city of Genova (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Savona (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Novara (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Padova (Italy), 4 participants from the city of Bologna (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Vicenza (Italy), 1 participant from the city of Latina (Italy).

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Artena (Rome, Italy)** from 14/07/2018 to 15/07/2018

Short description: The aim of this phase was to have a more widespread discussion across Italy. In order to achieve that, during the course of six months, we prompted all the local sections that make up our organization to hold internal debates on one or more of the topics. All sections later submitted the results of their debates and these were summarized into five draft proposals.

During the first day of the concluding event, these documents were broadly discussed by all the participants; the discussion was opened by journalist Eric Jozsef. For the second day, we selected among the participants five discussion leaders, who had previous knowledge on the issue they were assigned. These groups finalised the proposals, that were later submitted for the event in Bruxelles, where they could be presented to all partner organizations.

Sub-EVENT 2.18

Participation: The event involved 90 citizens, 83 participants from Italy, including 2 participants from Hungary, 2 participants from Serbia, 3 participants from Ukraine

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Boves (Cuneo, Italy)** on 21/07/2018

Short description: The aim of the activity was to reflect and share different experiences of contrast to discriminations and to search for the way in which Europe can promote integration among citizens and among different countries. To do that, we have invited people from different countries to share experiences and points of view. In particular some countries have been particularly interested in discussing with us the importance of borders and discriminations:

- Bilal Aktas, Kurdish boy of the association "Chalak Events" (Turkey) and now living in Tours (France)
- Ilona Shevchuk, Kateryna Miachina and Nina Sali from the Ukraine association LEF (Lviv Educational Foundation)
- Sayed Mustafa Reza and Azadeh Zandi from Hungary and members of "Artemisszió Alapítvány Foundation"
- Sofjia Zinkovic and Relja Jankovic from the "Human Rights House" of Belgrade (Serbia)

EVENT 3 - MEETING in BRUSSELS

Participation: 39 citizens, including 22 participants from Italy, 4 participants from France, 1 participant from Belgium, 4 participants from Hungary, 2 participants from Germany, 1 participant from Turkey, 1 participant from Romanian, 2 participants from Poland and 1 participant from Finland.

Location/ Dates: The event took place in **Brussels (Belgium)** from 25/09/2018 to 30/09/2018

Short description: International meeting with delegates from each partner, included participant involved by the partner with different nationalities. First of all, we visited the "Parlamentarium" of Brussels to remember how European Institutions work. Then, divided in 5 commissions, one for each topic, we worked at the finalization of the document of proposals for the future of Europe. In particular each group started from the drafts prepared in the previous step by each partner and prepare the final section for the official document. It was an exercise of democracy throughout the all decision-making process while discussing and writing the document, in particular each aspect of the proposals document has been voted by the assembly of participants.

When the document has been finalized we prepared a strategy of promotion and dissemination.

EVENT 4 - PROMOTION of THE DOCUMENT of PROPOSALS

Participation: 319 citizens, including 14 participants from Hungary, 42 participants from Belgium, 154 participants from Italy and 97 participants from France

Location/ Dates: the event took place in Hungary, Italy, Belgium and France from 01/10/2018 to 10/01/2018

Short description: Promotion of the document of proposals and communication campaign.

The final proposals have been disseminated through 5 different instruments:

- the full document of proposals
- the abstract
- the multilingual video done in Brussels
- the five images of the topics with key-words
- the leaflet

and through different channels

- emails (through local/national and European institutions)
- Facebook page of the project
- social networks and websites of partners
- articles
- public events (formal and non-formal) organized by each association in their own country and involving institutions, politicians, journalists, NGOs, researchers, scholars.

Sub-EVENT 4.1

Participation: The event involved 23 citizens, including participants from the cities of Nancy, Reims, Strasbourg, Dijon (France) etc.

Location /Dates: The event took place in **Nancy (France)**, from 06/10/2018 to 07/10/2018

Short description: The aim of the event was to train the new volunteers of Les Jeunes européens France to the activities of the association. On that frame, we organized trainings, and workshops about the activities, but also about the political propositions of Les Jeunes européens. We talked about the propositions which was written during the project Enjoy Your Future, and the participants had the opportunity to know them better. Then, we organized a street action, during which the participants talked to the people and the citizens about the proposition. So two steps was reached: first, a training step to know and understand the proposition. In the same time, the participants learnt how to talk about these propositions, and to make it strong. The second step was an action step, during which the participants could put in practice what they did learn during the training step.

The same structure has been repeated in following weeks in Montpellier, Lyon and Le Havre.

Participation: The event involved 20 citizens, including participants from the cities of Lyon, Clermont-Ferrand, Grenoble (France) etc.

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Lyon (France)**, from 20/10/2018 to 21/10/2018

Short description: Same activity done in Nancy in the sub-EVENT 4.1.

Sub-EVENT 4.3

Participation: The event involved 25 citizens from Le Havre, Lille, Strasbourg.

Location / Dates: The event took place in **Le Havre (France)**, from 10/11/2018 to 11/11/2018

Short description: Same activity done in Nancy in the sub-EVENT 4.1.

Sub-EVENT 4.4

Participation: The event involved 14 citizens, including 14 participants from the city of Budapest, Hungary.

Location / Dates: The event took place in Meeting area (**Budapest, Hungary**), on 14/11/2018

Short description: The aim of the event was to introduce the document of proposals of the project. At the first part Bernadett Mészáros and Bálint Caesar (both together were at the Brussels meeting) found a conclusion why the project is important for the association and for the young people. At the second part they introduced how the European Parliament and decision making is working and played games with the participants which was related with the topics of the project.

Sub-EVENT 4.5

Participation: The event involved 24 citizens, including 17 participants from the city of Brussels (Belgium), 3 participants from the city of Liège (Belgium), 2 participants from the city of Maastricht (The Netherlands), 1 participant from the town of Gingelom (Belgium), and 1 participant from the city of Ghent (Belgium).

Location / Dates: The event took place in Auberge de Jeunesse George Simenon (**Liège, Belgium**), from 23/11/2018 to 25/11/2018

Short description: The aim of the event was training our most active volunteers on how to disseminate the results of the Enjoy Your Future in public (especially on social media). We had specific sessions on how to deal with “trolls” attacking your posts on social media platforms and on how to build a strong message/story around the recommendations. To make our sessions stronger, we invited expert speakers: Philipp Blum, Flavio Grazian, Max Frey and Sarah Dejaegher. Before the event, we also did an outreach to all Belgian MEPs to inform them about the recommendations of the Enjoy Your Future project and we invited them to our *Training and Advocacy Days*. Additionally, we reached out to some local politicians from Liège to invite them as well. Eventually, we had a panel including Belgian MEP Marc Tarabella, local politician Benjamin Bodson (Liège city council), and Max Frey, assistant to German MEP Martina Werner. We had a discussion about the Enjoy Your Future recommendations with this panel of politicians.

On Sunday, G.F.E. elaborated on the results of the debates within the working groups and included them in an official political document. All this work will be useful for the campaign for European election.
